## TRAINING LOGISTICS:

- 1. Download and install the Zoom client on your computer. This training is 100% online and we will be using and recording via Zoom. You can download zoom here.
- 2. Have a personal Gmail account. We will be using Google Classroom to organize all assignments. If you do not already have a personal Gmail account, you will need to create one by June 1st. School district/corporate email accounts will not work due to the security/firewall protections in place. We cannot send you Google assignments until you are signed up in our Google classroom via your personal Gmail account. This is listed in the pre-training checklist below.
- 3. You will be turning in PDFs of many of your assignments. Please <u>do not send picture files</u>; these are difficult to read. If you do not have a printer with a scanner, there are many phone apps that can take pictures of documents and convert them to a PDF. TurboScan is one we recommend but there are many choices.
